# Turned away by hosps, pregnant woman dies

**Facilities In Imphal Said They Had No Space**

**Imphal:** A 20-year-old pregnant woman, who was denied admission to five hospitals, including the RIMS and JNIMS in Imphal, died with her unborn child at the entrance gate of a private hospital here on Thursday morning.

The state government has instituted a two-member committee to probe the incident. The deceased, Kampatliu Kamei, was a resident of Puchi village in Noney district.

The incident comes in the wake of reported deaths of pregnant women, with hospitals occupied for treating Covid-19 patients. The Women Action for Development had demanded that the state government arranges a temporary maternity hospital and special gynaec ward in each district.

An order issued by Manipur health and family welfare department's joint secretary, R Rang Peter, on Thursday said the committee shall submit its report to the health department within one

week.

The victim's family said Kampatliu arrived at Senapati district hospital at 2 pm on Wednesday with the doctors assuring that delivery would be done there.

As her condition worsened around 10.30 pm, the doctors advised the patient's party to go to well-equipped hospitals in Imphal, they said, adding that they reached JNIMS hospital around 12.30 am.

At JNIMS, she was refused treatment despite having a Covid-negative test result. The nurses told the family that there was no doctor to treat her. They then moved to RIMS hospital but the same response was given to them, and with no other option they went to a nearby private hospital, but even there she was allegedly refused admission.

They also abortively approached another other private hospital in Imphal but met the same fate, the family members said, adding that they then moved to another private here where she and her unborn child passed away at its casualty entrance around 4 am before they could approach the hospital authorities.

## Assam flood situation better, 84,000 still hit across 10 districts

**Guwahati:** Flood waters continued to recede in Assam improving the situation considerably, though 84,100 people across 10 districts are still affected by the calamity, an official bulletin said on Thursday.

At present, 177 villages and 15,964 hectare of crop areas are under water, the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) said in its bulletin.

More than 1.43 lakh people in 270 villages across 15 districts had been reeling under the deluge on Wednesday.

Roads were damaged in Dhubri district, while erosion has been witnessed at some places of Baksa because of the flood, ASDMA said.

A total of 157 animals have lost their lives in flood-related incidents, while 174 others were rescued in Kaziranga National Park, the bulletin said.

The deluge has also affected 38,415 domestic animals and poultry across the state during the last 24 hours, it added. TNN

**SC: Tripura's alt apt to axed teachers not derogatory**

**New Delhi:** SC on Thursday greenlighted the Tripura government's proposal to absorb over 10,000 terminated post-graduate, graduate and under-graduate teachers as peons, night guards, gardeners, cooks and lower division clerks.

Tripura government in 2010 and 2014 recruited 1,035 PGTs, 4,666 TGTs and 4,612 UGTs through oral interview under the Revised Employment Policy, 2003. The High Court on May 7, 2014 set aside the 2003 policy and quashed the appointment of all teachers. The SC on March 29, 2017 upheld the HC order, directed framing of new policy and recruitment thereunder by December 31, 2017.

Citing over 15,000 vacancies in teachers posts in the states, these terminated teachers had made a second attempt in the SC for absorption in the posts. But, a bench

Writing the judgment for the bench, Justice U U Lalit said, "The candidates, if they are otherwise competent and eligible, will certainly have every opportunity till March 31, 2023, to get selected for the posts of teachers in the State and by way of additional benefit those who are unsuccessful in such attempts may retain the alternate employment. In our view, it does not amount to any degradation."
